CBI Quarterfinal Round Takes Place on Monday

PRINCETON, N.J. - The 2010 College Basketball Invitational returns to action on Monday with Quarterfinal Round action.

At 7:00pm (ET), Virginia Commonwealth will play host to Charleston in a game that will be aired live on HDNet. The Cougars (22-11), fresh off an 82-79 win at Eastern Kentucky, are led by junior guard Andrew Goudelock, who earned first-team All-Southern Conference honors and has a team-best 19.4 ppg average while also leading the Cougars with 3.8 assists per game. VCU (23-9), which beat George Washington 79-73, is led by the Colonial Athletic Association's Defensive Player of the Year and first-team all-conference selection Larry Sanders, a junior who tops the Rams' statistics chart with 14.5 ppg and 9.0 rpg averages.

The second game of the HDNet doubleheader gets underway at 9:00pm (ET) and features Green Bay at Saint Louis. The Phoenix (22-12), 70-66 victors over Akron, have posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in 14 years. Junior Rahmon Fletcher garnered first-team All-Horizon League honors and is averaging 15.8 ppg. The youngest team in the country, Saint Louis (21-11) is paced by Atlantic 10 second-team honoree sophomore Kwamain Mitchell, who leads the Billikens with his 16.2 ppg average. The Bills downed Indiana State, 63-54, in their CBI opener.

Morehead State will head to Boston to take on Boston University in a 7:00pm (ET) tip. At 24-10, the Eagles currently have the second-most wins in school history and, coupled with last year's 20-16 mark, have won 20 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in the history of the program. Included in that victory total is a 74-60 win over Colorado State in the Opening Round of the CBI. Highlighting the MSU lineup is Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year Kenneth Faried, who owns team best averages of 16.8 ppg and 13.1 rpg. BU (20-13) won its first postseason since 1959 with a 96-78 decision at Oregon State, tying a CBI single game record for points in the process. BU is led by two-time first-team All-America East honoree John Holland. Holland is America East's leading scorer at 19.2 ppg and ranks seventh all-time at Boston University.

IUPUI entertains Princeton in a 7:00pm (ET) affair. The Jaguars, who downed Hofstra 74-60 in their CBI opener, are 25-10 and have the most wins of any CBI team. Senior Robert Glenn and sophomore Alex Young pace the Jaguars. Glenn (19.9 ppg, 6.4 rpg) and Young (18.4 ppg, 4.6 rpg) both earned first-team All-Summit League honors, becoming IUPUI's first first-team duo since 2005-06. Princeton (21-8) posted a 65-51 win over Duquesne in its first round game. The Tigers are led by tandem of sophomore Douglas Davis and junior Dan Mavraides, both of whom were named to the All-Ivy League second-team. Davis leads the Tigers in scoring with a 12.9 ppg average, while Mavraides is tallying 11.4 ppg to go along with a team-best 4.3 rebounds a game.

Once Monday's Quarterfinal Round is complete, the four remaining teams will be seeded for the Semifinal Round, which will take place on Wednesday. Both Semifinal Round games will be aired on HDNet. The Semifinal Round winners will then participate in the best-of-three Championship Series, which commences on Monday, March 29. HDNet will carry each game of the Championship Round.
