THE OPENING TIP

Fairfield University Men's Basketball returns to the national spotlight for the semifinal round of the Ro College Basketball Invitational. The Stags challenge Seattle on Tuesday, March 26 at 9 p.m. on ESPN2 with a berth in Wednesday's championship game on the line.

LAST TIME OUT

Caleb Fields set a new Fairfield single-season three-point record en route to 32 points to lift the Stags past Chicago State, 77-74, in the Ro College Basketball Invitational quarterfinals on Monday afternoon in Daytona Beach. Matt Curtis added 15 points and Jasper Floyd scored 13 for the Stags.

Fields made six three-pointers to run his season total to 109, surpassing the 104 treys converted by Tyler Nelson in his historic senior season of 2017-18. Fields' 32 points were one off his career high. He also hauled in five rebounds while playing all 40 minutes of the second straight game.

Curtis added a pair of triples to fuel his 15 points - the second straight double-digit scoring effort for Curtis following his career-high 19 points in Sunday's win over Little Rock. Floyd turned in another stuffed statsheet with 13 points, six rebounds, seven assists and two steals. He boosted his own program single-season record to 87 thefts on the season.

Alexis Yetna neared a double-double with eight points and nine rebounds, Louis Bleechmore scored four points, Birima Seck netted three and Peyton Smith added a pair.

The Cougars were led by 25 points from Wesley Cardet and 18 points by A.J.

COACH CASEY ON THE CBI QUARTERFINALS

"We stayed tough, we made just enough shots, and did enough to win it at the end. Caleb was on tonight, so we kept going to him and he delivered. But Jasper also made some big plays and Lex hit a couple of key free throws. It's another team win and we look forward to the chance to compete again as a team tomorrow."

Fairfield Removes Interim Tag and Names Chris Casey Head Coach of Men's Basketball

FAIRFIELD, Conn. - Ahead of postseason play at the MAAC Championship this week in Atlantic City, the second-seeded Stags will be led by Chris Casey, who has been named the head coach of the Fairfield Men's Basketball program. Casey and the Stags, who finished the regular season with a 20-11 record, open postseason play at Boardwalk Hall on Wednesday, March 13 at 9 p.m.

"I am extremely excited for this opportunity. Fairfield is an outstanding university on an exceptional trajectory," said Casey. "To be given the chance to lead our men's basketball program is an honor and the task will always get our best efforts. Thank you to President Mark Nemec and Vice President for Athletics Paul Schlickmann for their support and confidence in us. This has been a very successful season and we look forward to continuing that success in the future! Go Stags!"

After four seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Stags, Casey was appointed Interim Head Coach in October of 2023. Fairfield's 20 victories this season are the most for the program since 2011-12, and the 14-6 conference mark is the Stags' best since the 2010-11 campaign.

"Coach Casey has done an exceptional job leading our program on and off the court this season," said Vice President for Athletics Paul Schlickmann. "He has earned this opportunity and the competitive success we have achieved thus far is a byproduct of the sense of unity, relentless work ethic, positive energy and selfless approach that he and his staff have instilled in our team this year. There is great positive momentum with Fairfield Basketball and we are all committed to using this season's progress as a springboard for continued success with Coach Casey at the helm."

Casey's team this season was led on the court by three All-MAAC performers. Jalen Leach was selected as a member of the All-MAAC First Team, Caleb Fields claimed All-MAAC Second Team laurels and Brycen Goodine was slotted for the Third Team and chosen as MAAC Sixth Player of the Year. Fairfield had not had three All-MAAC honorees in one season since 2010-11.

"We are delighted that Chris Casey will continue to lead our men's basketball program into the future, and are excited about our upward trajectory reflected in the standard and style of play the Stags have demonstrated this season," said university President Mark R Nemec, PhD. "Chris knows the level of success that we are determined to reach, represents the values and integrity of our university, and is truly passionate about the wellbeing and holistic development of our student-athletes as young men of purpose as we take our men's basketball program to new heights."

The 14th head coach in Fairfield University Men's Basketball history, Casey is in his 38th year as a college basketball coach. As a head coach, he was a part of the MAAC for six years at Niagara from 2013-19. His tenure in Western New York included a 19-win campaign in 2017-18 that saw the Purple Eagles finish 12-6 in the MAAC as the third-seeded team in the conference. He joined Niagara after a three-year stretch at LIU Post highlighted by back-to-back East Coast Conference Championships and NCAA postseason appearances. Casey's first head-coaching stop was at Division III Rutgers-Newark from 1998-2001.

Casey's assistant coaching career began as a part of the first two Division I seasons in Central Connecticut State history from 1986-88. After a return to his alma mater Western Connecticut State for one season, he reentered the Division I ranks with stops at St. Francis and Saint Peter's.

Following his stint as head coach at Rutgers-Newark, Casey rejoined the staff at CCSU from 2001-06. He was a part of the Blue Devils' 2002 NEC Championship squad and was recognized as an AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003. In 2006, he moved on to Norm Roberts' staff at St. John's for a four-year tenure that included a trip to the 2010 National Invitation Tournament.

Casey graduated from Western Connecticut State in 1986 with a degree in Business Administration. He earned a Master's in Education Administration from Central Connecticut State in 1993.

Brycen Goodine Named MAAC Sixth Player of the Year

FAIRFIELD, Conn. - Already an All-MAAC Third Team honoree for the 2023-24 campaign, Brycen Goodine has been selected by the head coaches of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference as the MAAC Sixth Player of the Year. Goodine averages 14.6 points per game for Fairfield University Men's Basketball and is one of the nation's most efficient three-point shooters.

Goodine came off the bench in 21 of his 28 appearances for the Stags, averaging 25.9 minutes per contest. His .490 three-point percentage ranks him second in the nation as a part of an overall .518 field goal percentage that slots fifth in the MAAC. Goodine, who ranks ninth in the conference with 14.6 points per game, owns the MAAC's two highest-scoring games of the season. He netted 40 points in a Jan. 5 win at Siena and poured in 37 in last Thursday's Senior Night win over Canisius on ESPNU.

Goodine scored in double figures in 23 contests, including 15 during MAAC play. He averaged 15.3 points per game and shot .515 from three-point range against conference foes. He is Fairfield's second consecutive MAAC Sixth Player of the Year. He joins TJ Long (2023), two-time winner Maurice Barrow (2013, 2014) and Mike Evanovich (2010) as Stags to have claimed the award, which was instituted in 2001.

Goodine was one of three Stags to earn All-MAAC honors on Monday, joining First Team selection Jalen Leach and Second Team pick Caleb Fields.

Fairfield enters the postseason at 20-11 overall and 14-6 in the MAAC to lock up the second seed. The Stags' first tournament contest is slated for Wednesday, March 13 at 9 p.m. in Atlantic City against the winner of Tuesday's meeting between seventh-seeded lona and tenth-seeded Manhattan.

Fairfield Backcourt Trio Earns All-MAAC Honors, Jalen Leach Tabbed for First Team

FAIRFIELD, Conn. - Three members of the Fairfield University Men's Basketball backcourt have been recognized with All-MAAC honors, as voted upon by the league's 11 head coaches and announced by the conference office on Monday morning. Jalen Leach was named to the All-MAAC First Team, while Caleb Fields earned Second Team laurels and Brycen Goodine was tabbed for the Third Team.

"I'm incredibly proud of Jalen, Caleb and Brycen for earning All-MAAC honors. All three have battled through adversity and injuries in their careers, but they never stopped working and never stopped believing in themselves," said Interim Head Coach Chris Casey. "I hope they are all very proud of what they have accomplished, but the best compliment I can give them is that I know they're all more focused on Wednesday night in Atlantic City than on any individual accolades."

Leach is Fairfield's first All-MAAC First Team selection since Tyler Nelson earned the distinction in back-to-back seasons in 2016-17 and 2017-18. He enters the postseason ranked fifth in the MAAC in scoring at 16.4 points per game, shooting at a .494 field goal percentage that slots sixth in the conference. Leach is also among the nation's leaders with a MAAC-best .901 free throw percentage. He slots fourth on the Stags with 4.1 rebounds per game, and second on the team with 3.1 assists and 1.8 steals per contest. Leach scored a career-high 29 points in a game twice during MAAC play, once in the Jan. 19 win over Saint Peter's and again in the recent comeback win at the Mount.

One of the most prolific three-point shooters in the nation, Fields collects All-MAAC Second Team honors after averaging 16.1 points per game. He leads the MAAC and ranks 13th nationally with 3.24 three-pointers per game, shooting .403 from deep to rank second in the conference. Fields has also reeled in 3.8 rebounds per outing to go along with 2.4 assists and 1.5 steals per game. He was Fairfield's leading scorer during the 20-game MAAC schedule with 18.0 points per game, highlighted by a 33-point contest in which he tied the Fairfield record with 10 treys in a win over Marist.

Goodine primarily came off the bench for the Stags, amassing 14.6 points per game. His .490 three-point percentage ranks him second in the nation as a part of an overall .518 field goal percentage that slots fifth in the MAAC. Goodine owns the MAAC's two highest-scoring games of the season, netting 40 points in a Jan. 5 win at Siena and going for 37 in last Thursday's Senior Night win over Canisius on ESPNU. Goodine fills out his statline with 2.9 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game.

The last time Fairfield had three All-MAAC picks was in the 2010-11 campaign with Derek Needham tabbed for the First Team, Ryan Olander on the Second Team and Yorel Hawkins picked for the Third Team.

Fairfield enters the postseason at 20-11 overall and 14-6 in the MAAC to lock up the second seed. The Stags' first tournament contest is slated for Wednesday, March 13 at 9 p.m. in Atlantic City against the winner of Tuesday's meeting between seventh-seeded Iona and tenth-seeded Manhattan.

TRENDING UPWARDS

At 24-12 overall, Fairfield has secured its first 20-win season since a 22-15 campaign in 2011-12. The current campaign marks the eighth 20-win season in Fairfield history and the fourth time that the Stags have earned 23 or more Division I victories in a season. With a win on Tuesday, the Stags would tie Ed Cooley's 2010-11 team (25-8) for the most wins in a season in Fairfield Basketball history. At 14-6 in the MAAC, the Stags posted their most conference wins since a 15-3 performance en route to the MAAC Regular Season Championship in 2010-11.

500 POINT SCORERS

Caleb Fields has scored a team-best 572 points this season, which ties him with Hall of Famer Troy Bradford's 1988-89 campaign for sixth on Fairfield single-season scoring list. Prior to this season, no Stag had topped 500 points in a season since Tyler Nelson netted his record-breaking 732 points in the 2017-18 campaign. Field's current 16.8 points per game are also the most for a Stag since Nelson in that season, when he averaged 20.2 points per contest.

Joining Fields in the 500+ point club is Jalen Leach adding 519. The last time that two Stags had 500 in the same season was in 2015-16 when Nelson poured in 529 points and Marcus Gilbert scored 519. Should Leach and Fields both maintain their scoring averages, they would be the first Fairfield teammates to each average at least 16.0 points per game since Derek Needham and Anthony "Peanut" Johnson in the 2009-10 season.

CALEB FIELDS: SINGLE-SEASON THREE-POINT RECORD

Speaking of Nelson's 2017-18 season, Caleb Fields drained six three-pointers on Monday to run his total to 109 treys this season, surpassing Nelson's 104 made treys in that campaign. While Fields needed one more game than Nelson to eclipse his total, the graduate student has averaged more made three-pointers per game and shot at a higher percentage from distance than Nelson.

IT'S NEVER TOO LATE TO GET STARTED

With Alexis Yetna joining the starting lineup for the MAAC Championship and Matt Curtis entering the starting five in the CBI First Round, both have the distinction of making their first start of the season (and of their Fairfield careers) after the conclusion of the regular season.

REPEAT REJECTED

With a MAAC Quarterfinal win over Iona, Fairfield knocked off the defending MAAC Champion in the conference tournament for the first time in their last five attempts. The Stags had previously lost to reigning champs Niagara in 2006, Siena in 2009 and 2010, Iona in 2018 and Saint Peter's in 2023. Previously, the most recent successful dethroning of the champion came in 2005 when the third-seeded Stags downed sixth-seeded Manhattan in the quarterfinals MAAC Championship in Buffalo.

SECOND TIME AROUND

Eight of Fairfield's 10 MAAC series wrapped up as a sweep in one direction or the other. The Stags swept the season series from Manhattan, Rider, Saint Peter's, Siens, Canisius and The Mount, and were on the short side of both meetings with Iona and Niagara. The only splits were with Quinnipiac and Marist. The six MAAC homeand-home sweeps were the most for Fairfield since the 2010-11 Stags broke out the brooms six times en route to a 15-3 mark and a MAAC Regular Season Championship.

MAN OF STEAL

Jasper Floyd has set a new Fairfield single-season record with 87 steals and counting, surpassing the 74 swipes by Kyle Commodore in the 1998-99 campaign. Floyd ranks ninth in the nation with a MAAC-best 2.42 steals per game.

BG = BUCKETS GALORE

With 40 points on Jan. 5 at Siena and 37 points in the March 7 win over Canisius, Brycen Goodine owns the MAAC's two highest-scoring games of the season. His 40-point effort was one of four 40-point games in Fairfield history.

The MAAC Sixth Player of the Year, Goodine owns the only 40-point game as a reserve in the last two seasons in Division I. He was, however, a Senior Night starter for

Goodine is the only player in the nation this season with **TWO** games scoring 37 or more points while attempting fewer than 20 field goals.

Goodine and the legendary George Groom are the only two Fairfield players to score 37 or more points twice in their careers as a Stag.

RAINING THREES...

Fairfield's 18 made three-pointers in the home win over The Mount on Feb. 18 set a new program record. The prior mark of 17 treys was attained twice in a 33-day span in 2015 at Maryland Eastern Shore and again six games later at Bucknell.

FACTS, FIGURES AND MORE

...POURING POINTS

Fueled by their record-setting performance from downtown, the Stags scored a season-best 94 points. The showing marked the most points scored in a game by a Fairfield squad since a 110-55 win over Medgar Evers on Nov. 16, 2021 and the most against a Division I opponent since beating Quinnipiac, 102-98, on Feb. 17, 2018.

Fairfield topped that scoring effort with a 96-point outburst in the comeback win at The Mount to close the regular season on March 9. In that contest, the Stags erased a 16-point halftime deficit en route to a thrilling 96-92 triumph.

20s ALL AROUND

In the win over Rider on Feb. 8, Jalen Leach netted 22 points while Caleb Fields and Jasper Floyd each contributed 20. The last time a trio all hit the 20-point mark for the Stags was Jan. 4, 2016 when Marcus Gilbert scored 21 points while Tyler Nelson and Jerry

Johnson Jr. each had 20 in a 97-85 win over Dartmouth.

THE LEX EXPRESS

Alexis Yetna made his Fairfield debut on Feb. 8 against the Broncs. He scored five points with one rebound in his first game since challenging TCU as a member of Seton Hall in the NCAA Championship on March 18, 2022.

Two days after Brycen Goodine's 40-point game, Caleb Fields made headlines of his own by tying the Fairfield program record with 10 three-pointers in the Stags' 82-61 win over Marist at Mahoney Arena. Fields, who netted a career-high 33 points in the game including the 1,000th of his career, is one of 10 Division I players to hit 10 treys in a game this season and one of just six to do so against a Division I opponent. Fields matched the program record set by Landon Taliaferro, who had 10 treys en route to 34 points in the Stags' upset win over Texas A&M on Dec. 1, 2019.

NOTABLE NETS

Fairfield owns the MAAC's strongest non-conference wins of the season, per the most recent NET rankings. The Stags hold a Quad 2 win at #87 Yale, the Ivy League Tournament Champion. The conference's only other Quad 2 win is a Canisius victory at #82 St. Bonaventure.

CHAMPS CLIPPED

Fairfield defeated three eventual conference champs and NCAA postseason qualifiers during the regular season with wins over Yale (Ivy), Wagner (NEC) and a pair of victories against MAAC Champion Saint Peter's.

Brycen Goodine (40 pts. at Siena) and Caleb Fields (33 vs. Marist) posted back-to-back 30-point games for Fairfield for the first time since Marcus Gilbert had 32 points at UMES on Nov. 24, 2015 and went for 33 three days later in a win over Columbia. The last time two different Stags had 30 in back-to-back games was in 1982, when Tony George netted 31 against Saint Joseph's (12/11/82) and Pete DeBisschop dropped 39 on Hofstra (12/18/82). DeBisschop had 30 points in the next game as well (12/21/82 at Boston College), which is the last time Fairfield had a 30-point scorer in three straight contests.

STREAK STATS

Fairfield's eight-game winning streak from Dec. 3 to Jan. 7 was its first since 2010-11, when the Stags won 11 in a row. The Stags also won five consecutive road games during streak, matching a similar run from 2021-22.

Fairfield's last six-game road winning streak came when the Stags won 13 in a row from 1985-87, including a perfect 12-0 in true road contests during the 1985-86 MAAC Championship season.

FACTS, FIGURES AND MORE

NON-CONFERENCE NOTABLES

Fairfield's 11-game non-conference schedule included members of eight different conferences. With the exception of the Division III Skyline Conference, the longest drought that the Stags ended this season was against the Atlantic Sun when they tangled with Queens on Nov. 18. Fairfield had not played an A-Sun opponent since meeting Jacksonville during the 2017-18 campaign.

LOW SCORING WINS

The 63-51 win over Wagner marked Fairfield's lowest scoring total in a victory this season, surpassing the 67-57 triumph at Sacred Heart just eight days prior. Not coincidentally, Fairfield posted its two best defensive efforts against Division I competition in those back-to-back wins.

PLAYING FAVORITES

The Dec. 9 win at Sacred Heart marked the third straight road victory for Fairfield against a team that was tabbed by to win its conference in the preseason. The Stags dispatched MAAC preseason favorite Rider (88-81), Ivy League presumptive favorite Yale (75-71) and the NEC preseason #1 Pioneers (67-57).

HOME 'DOGS

Prior to Fairfield's Dec. 6 win at Yale, the Bulldogs had won 12 consecutive games against Connecticut opponents. The Stags' victory also concluded a 100-game stretch in which Yale owned an 83-17 record in home games.

PEYTON SMITH: MAAC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

After scoring in double figures in all three games on the week of Nov. 13, Peyton Smith was selected as the MAAC Rookie of the Week. Smith averaged 13.0 points per game in the Stags' three contests against MSMC, Drexel and Queens, shooting .692 from the floor. The 6-10 freshman filled out his statline with 5.7 rebounds per contest.

STAGS VS. NEW ENGLAND

The Stags are 166-183 all-time against the current Division I basketball programs in New England. Fairfield has never lost to regional foes Dartmouth (4-0), Merrimack (4-0) and Sacred Heart (10-0). The only two Division I teams in New England that the Stags have never defeated both reside in the Ocean State. Fairfield is 0-6 against Rhode Island and has never played Bryant, which joined the Division I ranks in 2008.

HEAD COACH CHRIS CASEYFIRST SEASON • WESTERN CONN. '86

College basketball veteran Chris Casey was named the interim head coach of Fairfield University Men's Basketball prior to the 2023-24 season and was tabbed as the 14th head coach in program history on March 12, 2024. Casey most recently served as an assistant with the Stags for the last four campaigns and previously led the programs at Niagara, LIU Post and Rutgers-Newark.

As a head coach, Casey was a part of the MAAC for six years at Niagara from 2013-19. His tenure in Western New York included a 19-win campaign in 2017-18 that saw the Purple Eagles finish 12-6 in the MAAC as the third-seeded team in the conference. He joined Niagara after a three-year stretch at LIU Post highlighted by back-to-back East Coast Conference Championships and NCAA

postseason appearances. Casey's first head-coaching stop was at Division III Rutgers-Newark from 1998-2001.

Casey's assistant coaching career began as a part of the first two Division I seasons in Central Connecticut

State history from 1986-88. After a return to his alma mater Western Connecticut State for one season, he reentered the Division I ranks with stops at St. Francis and Saint Peter's.

Following his stint as head coach at Rutgers-Newark, Casey rejoined the staff at CCSU from 2001-06. He was a part of the Blue Devils' 2002 NEC Championship squad and was recognized as an AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003. In 2006, he moved on to Norm Roberts' staff at St. John's for a four-year tenure that included a trip to the 2010 National Invitation Tournament.

Casey graduated from Western Connecticut State in 1986 with a degree in Business Administration. He earned a Master's in Education Administration from Central Connecticut State in 1993.
